The following question has been submitted by a tenant to our Main Office:

Q: What do I do when I find a washer left dirty by the previous user?

Boy, are we glad you asked! Every resident is responsible for keeping our shared laundry facilities clean and pleasant for everyone! Golden Rules of Laundry Etiquette:

• Wipe it Down: After using the washer, give it a quick wipe. There should not be any detergent residue or debris left behind.

- Lint-Free is Key: Clean the lint filter in the dryer after each use. This helps prevent fires and keeps the dryers running efficiently.
- Prompt Pickup: Don't leave your laundry unattended for long periods.
 Set a timer and retrieve your clothes promptly when they're done.

THIS MONTH'S GOOD IDEA

Nip those fruit flies on your own!

Those pesky fruit flies invading your kitchen? Don't despair! Here's a quick and easy home remedy to send them packing: The Vinegar Trap:

- 1. Sweet and Sour: Pour some apple cider vinegar into a small bowl or jar.
- 2.Surface Tension Trickery: Add a drop or two of dish soap. This breaks the surface tension of the vinegar, making it harder for the flies to escape.
- 3. Set it and Forget it: Leave the bowl uncovered near the source of the fruit flies (overripe fruit, garbage disposal, etc.).

The sweet smell of the vinegar will attract the fruit flies, and the dish soap will prevent them from flying away. Dispose after trapping!



THIS MONTH'S BAD IDEA

Vaping, instead of smoking, in your unit.

While vaping may be perceived as less harmful than traditional smoking, it still poses potential health risks and concerns for those exposed to secondhand vapor, and can also damage our units through prolonged use. NOTES FROM THE SERVICE COORDINATOR



Important Reminder: Medicare Open Enrollment Period (Oct 15 – Dec 7) To all residents, I want to emphasize the importance of the Medicare Open Enrollment Period, which runs from October 15 to December 7. If you are enrolled in Medicaid or Medicare, you are eligible to sign up for a Medicare Advantage Plan.

For those of you with plans such as United Healthcare, Anthem, Aetna, Humana, Medical Mutual, Devoted, and others, it's crucial to know that significant changes are coming in 2025. Some residents have mentioned that they've had the same plan for years, don't want to change, or believe that since they have both Medicaid and Medicare, they won't be affected by any costs. However, Medicare Advantage Plans often provide additional benefits that might be useful to you



If you currently have a Medicare Advantage Plan, I strongly recommend reviewing your plan annually. Co-pays for primary doctors, specialists, and medication costs may change year to year, and it's important to stay informed about what those changes are.

I understand that change can be difficult, but it's important to review your options. You're not obligated to switch plans, but knowing what's available to you can make all the difference in managing your healthcare needs.
